1. ACCESSIBILITY REPRESENTATIVE

Ms. Carole Robertson advised the Committee that she will no longer be the accessibility representative for the Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee and that a new representative will be appointed. She thanked everyone for their support during her time serving on the Committee.

3. MINUTES OF THE MARKHAM CYCLING AND PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JUNE 16, 2011

Moved by Councillor Don Hamilton Seconded by Peter Miasek

That the minutes of the Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee meeting held on June 16, 2011, be adopted.

4. QUESTIONS FOR THE TOWN SURVEY

The Committee had before them the four questions that Peter Miasek and Gord Walter prepared for the resident survey questionnaire.

The Committee discussed whether there should be a question to determine the skill level of cyclists in Markham.

The Committee suggested that the questions be amended as follows:

- 1. How often do you cycle?
 - Everyday, about once a week, about once a month, about once a year, never
- 2. What do you use your bicycle for?
 - Travel to/from school, travel to/from work, shopping, errands or recreation
- 3. What prevents you from using your bicycle more often for commuting or errands?
 - Will provide a selection list

The Committee suggested that if a forth question will be permitted that the following question be added:

- 4. What is your cycling ability?
 - Novice, experienced beginner, intermediate, advanced or expert

5. ECO TRANSPORT FAIR AT THE TASTE OF ASIA (JUNE 25, 26, 2011)

Mr. William To, Toronto Chinese Ecological Living (TCEL) delivered a PowerPoint presentation regarding the Eco Transport Fair at the Taste of Asia event that included a bicycle parking area.

There was discussion regarding whether TCEL would be interested in setting up a booth at other Markham festivals such as the Unionville Festival.

Jennifer Wong, York Region suggested that Mr. To contact her for next years event to obtain information on "Active Healthy Communities" that can be distributed at their booth.

6. YONGE STREET STREETSCAPE - PROPOSED CYCLING AND PEDESTRIAN FACILITY

Mr. Peter Miasek advised the Committee that York Region held public information sessions to inform residents about plans to transform Yonge Street from Steeles Avenue to Bantry Avenue (in Richmond Hill) into a vibrant, engaging street that will include 1.5 metre bike lane with buffer.

7. HIGHWAY 7 - DESIGN AND REVIEW

Mr. Peter Miasek advised the Committee that York Region has agreed to review the proposed design for Highway 7 from Town Centre Blvd. to Sciberras Road. It was suggested that two Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee members be appointed to participate in that review and have their names forwarded to Steve Kemp, York Region.

Moved by Councillor Don Hamilton Seconded by Gerrald Corbett

That Peter Miasek and Elisabeth Tan be the Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee members to work with York Region staff to review the Highway 7 design from Town Centre Blvd. to Sciberras Road; and,

That this information be forwarded to Steve Kemp, York Region.

Ms. Elisabeth Tan advised the Committee that "Markham Cycles" is a new organization that is still evolving. There are a few volunteers and five Markham Councillors who meet to discuss ways to encourage Markham residents to use their bikes in place of their cars.

Gord Walter provided the Committee with a brief overview of the Markham GIRO event advising it was a great success. He emphasized the need for more volunteers mainly during the registration period. Gord indicated that the breakfast was very successful however there may be a need to change the serving location of the food for next years event.

The Committee thanked the Town of Markham staff that assisted and volunteered their time at the GIRO event.

9. MARKHAM ROAD DETAILED DESIGN

There was discussion with respect to some Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee members reviewing the detailed road design for Markham Road and Birchmount Road.

Moved by Peter Miasek Seconded by Gord Walter

That the Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (CPAC) request the Town of Markham to permit the participation of CPAC representatives during the cycling and pedestrian design review for Markham Road (16th Avenue to Major Mackenzie Drive), Birchmount Road and all other future road design reviews.

11. MULTI-USE PATHWAY ALONG MAJOR MACKENZIE DRIVE

Ms. Michelle Holmes, Rouge Park advised the Committee that the Tour de Greenbelt took place on Saturday September 17, 2011 and had about 400 participants.
