Message from the Mayor Markham is More

Markham is more than one of Canada's premier municipalities. Markham is a leader in innovation, sustainability, financial management and community building. Our track record speaks for itself. In everything we do, we put people first and continually enhance the customer experience while always respecting tax dollars. Residents have come to expect service excellence and we pride ourselves on excellent and efficient service delivery.

Markham is more than just Canada's most diverse city. We are a beacon of inclusivity, a close-knit set of communities stitched into a beautiful mosaic comprising of people from all over the world. Our Diversity Action Plan anchors the work we are doing to ensure that everyone feels welcome, heard and included. We continued on our Truth and Reconciliation journey and were awarded the hosting rights to the 50th Anniversary of the 2024 Little Native Hockey League Tournament, Cultural Festival and Gala, which took place in March.

Markham is more than just a well-planned city. We have a housing pledge that is guiding our work to support the provincial goal of building 1.5 million new homes, 44,000 of which are earmarked for Markham. We are fast-tracking important construction projects like the new Highway 404 collector bridge north of 16th Avenue to get people moving faster. New pedestrian safety crossings and school safety zones were unveiled to keep residents safe. We were also awarded \$2.5 million to launch an automotive and mobility demonstration zone in Markham Centre.

Markham is more than just an economic powerhouse. Our new Economic Development and Culture Strategy will guide our plan to retain and attract business to Markham while we also seek to advance the Markham

Innovation Exchange, our signature new innovation district. The Markham Pan Am Centre continues its impressive rise as one of the province's top sporting destinations playing host to 500,000 athletes at 95 international, national and regional sporting events.

Markham is more than an environmentally-focused City. We're building trails and parks, planting thousands of trees, and protecting neighbourhoods from the risks of flooding. Five new parks were unveiled in 2023, adding to our already impressive inventory of greenspaces. We are a leader in sustainability, greening our fleet and facilities, improving our waste diversion rate, piloting geothermal energy systems in new housing subdivisions and expanding our award-winning district energy system. To support our furry friends and their owners, we unveiled an off-leash dog park pilot program with locations across the city.

Markham is more than just a responsible caretaker of your tax dollars. Residents receive exceptional services that are fiscally responsible. Markham continues to receive national awards for its budgeting practices and has maintained the 18-year lowest average tax increase in the GTA.

Markham is more because our staff, along with many more people in the community make it so. I thank our residents, our businesses and our many partners who have contributed to our success.

Message from the CAO

The City of Markham is an award-winning municipality with a laser focus on driving efficiencies, innovating in constantly changing times and delivering exceptional services by exceptional people. We are committed to delivering high quality programs and services that meet and exceed the expectations of residents and businesses. This is our excellence journey and I am delighted to present you a report highlighting our accomplishments from 2023.

The City maintained momentum on accomplishing its goals and actions identified in our Strategic Plan. We also approved an extension to our current strategic and launched consultations with members of council and the public on what additional action items to include in the refreshed version.

In 2022, our Contact Centre celebrated its 20th anniversary. This important milestone highlights our efforts throughout the last 20 years to deliver exceptional customer service. We have expanded that service by offering after-hours assistance for emergencies and launched an updated virtual assistant capable of answering over 100 service categories. A new recreation and culture registration system was successfully launched in 2023 with over 101,000 user accounts created. The new system makes enrolling in recreation, culture and library programs, and the booking of City facilities, easier for residents by allowing them to do everything in one place, resulting in a better user experience. We continued important work to keep our community safe, resilient and future-ready with flood mitigation efforts. To support the goal of building 1.5 million homes, 44,000 of which are targeted for Markham, we provided comments to the Provincial Government on various legislation,

adopted a housing pledge and were successful in receiving \$58.8 million from the Federal Government to support the delivery of 1,900 residential units across 7 projects in Markham. Markham also stood above the rest, winning national recognitions for innovations in road operations, sustainability efforts and the 2022 municipal election.

I am honoured to lead a dedicated and passionate group of city builders. In everything we do, we have our customer's interests top of mind. In 2023, we were once again recognized as one of Canada's top employers in Forbes' annual list. The City of Markham also received the Canadian Award for Financial Reporting for the 21st consecutive year. The City is committed to ensuring our workforce reflects the community we serve and we began important work on implementing first year actions in the Diversity Action Plan.

The City has made great strides in accomplishing our goals established in the current Strategic Plan. We remain committed to working closely with our community to deliver a strong, cohesive and livable city where everyone feels included and celebrated. I look forward to sharing more of our progress in 2024.
